Órla is a visual artist, creative educationalist and an arts manager. She has worked with children for over a decade, creating work in Dublin and continental Europe. Her own education includes a Diploma in Psychology from Maynooth, a Degree in Fine Art from Limerick College of Art and Design and a Masters in Arts Management from Anglia Ruskin University, Cambridge.

# Playful Architecture

#### Can we build a home together?

Birds live in nests high in trees, insects

live in burrows under the ground, bees live in hives and snails live in the house they carry on their backs.

Together we investigate where these creatures live and how they build their homes, gathering some of their ideas to create a wonderful playful house of our own. This engaging event explores the theme of home through play and the visual arts. (Note: warm water proof clothes are necessary with appropriate outdoor footwear)

Helen Barry is a visual artist and the co-founder of Early Childhood Creativity. She has over 25 years experience of working with children and young people through the visual arts, arts education, television and community arts. Helen's primary focus is on sculpture; her work investigates the architecture of buildings and spaces that bring people & communities together. As part of this exploration Helen has entrusted early years children with some of her own ideas and together they enjoy discovering what they can create. This in turn informs Helen further about her own art practice.

Helen initiated You Can Play Too an interactive arts programme specifically designed for early years and their parents and is the author and illustrator of *You Can Play Too*, the accompanying arts activity book. Helen has a Degree in Fine Art from the University of Central England and has studied Art Therapy and Islamic Art & Architecture. She is a current member of the Broadstone Studios, Dublin.

#### **Getting to Farmleigh Estate**

Farmleigh is accessed through the Phoenix Park.
The Phoenix Park shuttle bus service operates from 10am every 20 minutes from a terminus outside the park beside the Luas Bridge at Park Gate Street. The bus travels a return journey from Park Gate Street to Dublin Zoo, then on to Farmleigh, down to the Papal Cross and Visitor's Centre and returns to Park Gate Street.

Entering the Phoenix Park through the Castleknock Gate, take a right at the first roundabout & then your first right again. Farmleigh is at the end of this road. Parking available.
